Our goal is to be responsive to the academic and social-emotional needs of each student, and we view you as essential partners in this process.

To ensure we consider all relevant factors, we invite you to share any information you believe will help as teachers and staff make thoughtful decisions for next year. Please use the following link to provide input for your student(s): <u>DOES Parent Consideration Form (SY 25-26)</u>.

When making placements, our staff and administration carefully consider several factors to create diverse and balanced classrooms. These include, but are not limited to:

- The personality of the child
- Gender balance in each classroom
- Strengths and needs in math, reading, and writing
- Assessment/Test results and academic needs
- Special education and 504 Plan requirements, including specific IEP goals
- Structured versus unstructured needs
- Input from previous teachers and school counselors

While we value your input, there are certain requests that we cannot accommodate through this form. Specifically, we ask that you do not use the form to:

- Request specific teachers
- Request groupings based on siblings' experiences or friendships
- Propose groupings based on hearsay

Your input on this form will assist us in making thoughtful, balanced decisions for your child, rather than requesting a specific teacher. Participation in this process is entirely optional, but your insights are incredibly valuable to our staff and to your child's future teacher.

Please submit all consideration forms by **Friday**, **May 2**, **2025**. Thank you for your ongoing support and for being an important part of our school community.

### **Counselor's Corner**

As the flowers bloom and testing season approaches, it's the perfect time to cultivate a sense of calm and focus within your family. Mindfulness practices can help children manage stress by regulating emotions, improve concentration, and build emotional resilience, all crucial skills for navigating academic challenges. Increasing self-awareness through mindfulness can foster a deeper understanding of thoughts and feelings, leading to greater self-compassion, too!

Below are some suggestions of strategies that can be practiced at home and easily implemented in the classroom:

"Square Breathing" Technique

- Have your child visualize a square.
- Instruct them to slowly inhale for a count of 4, while tracing the first side of the square.
- Hold their breath for a count of 4, tracing the second side.
- Exhale slowly for a count of 4, tracing the third side.
- Pause for a count of 4, tracing the final side.

Positive Self-Talk

- Encourage your child to replace negative thoughts with positive affirmations.
- Examples: "I am prepared," "I can do this," "I am calm and focused."
- Help them create a list of empowering phrases they can repeat to themselves before tests or during stressful moments.
- This can be practiced by writing down the phrases and repeating them out loud, or silently.

Mindful Doodling or Coloring

- Provide your child with coloring books, blank paper, or mandala templates.
- Encourage them to focus on the colors, textures, and sensations of the drawing or coloring process.
- This activity allows them to engage their senses and quiet their minds.

#### 5-4-3-2-1 Grounding Technique

This technique is great for bringing awareness to the present moment, especially when feeling overwhelmed. Instruct your child to:

- Name 5 things they can see.
- Name 4 things they can touch.
- Name 3 things they can hear.
- Name 2 things they can smell.
- Name 1 thing they can taste.

By incorporating these simple mindfulness practices into your family's routine, you can help your children navigate testing season with greater ease and cultivate valuable life skills that will benefit them far beyond the classroom.

# Health Room News

Allergy season is upon us, and we just want to remind everyone to medicate their children at home with allergy medication prior to coming to school. Remember, the students do go outside for recess, and the P.E. Department takes the students outdoors for class. It is essential that children have their allergy medication before going outdoors, due to the high pollen count this time of year.

Please be sure that:

- Students take their allergy medications daily at home. Non-drowsy formulas are good choices because they won't leave your child tired and dehydrated, or have them take them before bed if they cause drowsiness.
- Wearing wraparound sunglasses which physically keep out pollen from eyes and may be a good choice for some students.
- If your child requires eye drops to be given at school, even if it is over the counter, a written prescription from your physician is required, along with the medication to be given, in its original unopened package by an adult to the school nurse.

### **Reminders About Arrival and Dismissal Procedures**

To ensure a smooth and safe arrival and dismissal for our students, please read the information below.

**SCHOOL HOURS:** 9:15 a.m. – 3:45 p.m.

#### ARRIVAL TIMES:

9:00 a.m. First bell rings/students may enter the building.

9:15 a.m. Second/late bell rings/students should be in the classroom.


Students should not be dropped off or let out of your vehicle until 9:00 a.m. Supervision is not available for students before this time. Before and after care is available through Howard County Parks and Recreation as well as other before and after school providers in the community.

All children who are late must be accompanied by a parent and be signed into school in the front office.

DISMISSAL TIMES: Dismissal begins at 3:45 pm.

If you have to make a change to your student's dismissal, please send a note and/or email to their teacher, and notify the front office. If you have to make a change during the day, after your student has arrived at school, please email your child's teacher AND email the front office staff at: <u>doesfrontoffice@hcpss.org</u>. <u>No students will be released from the front office for</u> <u>early dismissal after 3:30pm</u>. This will help to ensure the safety of our students and cut down on confusion at the end of the day as afternoon dismissal begins.

**Arrival and Dismissal Procedures and Expectations:** Please see the visual below for the flow of our car loop. Below the visual are the expectations and instructions for making arrival and dismissal of your student(s) as efficient and safe as possible.



#### Reminders for arrival and dismissal:

Use the car loop to drop off students. When you enter the parking lot, you must make the full loop around.

- There is NO PASSING in the carpool loop, unless directed by a DOES staff member.
- Never leave a car unattended in the carpool loop/line.
- Pull up as far as possible (to the peninsula sidewalk) before letting your child exit the vehicle. Please make sure there are no spaces between cars.
- Children will be let out of the passenger side of the vehicle only. Staff will assist children with getting in and out of the car. Parents should NOT get out of the car.
- Do not turn left to enter the bus loop area between 8:45 a.m. and 9:15 a.m. or between 3:15 p.m. and 3:45 p.m.
- It is extremely unsafe to walk behind or between buses in the bus loop. Take the extra minute in line to ensure everyone's safety.
- Parents should avoid parking and walking in unless they have an appointment within the building. The car loop area is safer with less pedestrian traffic and fewer cars moving within the parking lot.
- If you need to park, you must park in the larger lot by the carpool loop. This is the only area with a crosswalk to ensure safety when walking toward the building.
- The parking spots parallel to Ten Oaks Road are designated as Staff Parking during arrival and dismissal. Entering or exiting your vehicle is unsafe from these parking spaces while traffic from the car loop is flowing.
- All traffic must flow in one direction.
- If you are leaving a parking spot during arrival or dismissal, follow the directions of school staff. You may need to wait for cars to continue through the car loop before you are directed to pull out of the lot. The priority is to keep the car loop flowing.

• Please be courteous and respectful to both staff and other families.

### **Health Room Reminders**

Any medications required during school hours including prescription, "over-the-counter" (OTC) and homeopathic/herbal medications require a medication order signed by an approved health care provider and are subject to the HCPSS medication policy and procedure.

#### Medication form

• Have a student with allergies? Learn more about ordering an epipen and our allergic reaction protocols.

School health room staff administer medications, store medications in the school's health room and keep records of when medications are taken by the student.

#### **Approved Non-Medications:**

The items below are not considered medications. Students may bring the items to school without a medical prescription. Health Services requests that a parent/guardian note accompany the item to serve as permission to bring to school.

- Sunscreen
- Chapstick
- Hand lotion
- Non-medicated cough drops
- Saline contact solution

Sunscreen must be supplied by an individual student and is not to be shared with other students due to potential allergens and skin reactions.

### Attendance/Reporting Absences

Parents can email <u>DOESabsence@hcpss.org</u> to report a student's absence. Please include your child(ren)'s full name, parent's/guardian's full name and phone number, the date your child(ren) was absent and the reason. Parents may instead choose to send in a paper excuse note to their child's teacher with the same information when the student returns to school.

For families requesting local discretionary absences, please complete a <u>Local Discretionary</u> <u>Absence Request Form</u> and submit it to the front office at least one week in advance.

### Volunteer Training Required for Volunteers and Visitors

Anyone volunteering at school in any capacity, including parents joining their children for lunch, are required to complete volunteer training prior to their first visit. Please visit <u>HERE</u> for more
