Message from the Office of Safety and Security

We appreciate everyone's help in making sure that our school is as safe as possible. All exterior doors are locked at all times. To maintain safety and security it is important that we all do our part:

- Do not let anyone in through exterior doors around the school.
- All visitors or anyone arriving late needs to check-in at the front lobby using the buzzer.
 We know it is in our nature to be nice and hold the door, but please do not let in people you do not know. The front office staff will be focusing on groups coming to the buzzer and ensuring that all parties check-in properly.
- Doors should not be propped open.
- If you see something suspicious, report it to a teacher, administrator, or other staff member.

Health Room News

Spring is blooming all around us and that means it is seasonal allergy time. Seasonal allergies can affect anyone and can affect you anytime. We hear "I have not been diagnosed with allergies" or "I have never had allergies before" frequently. Seasonal allergies are something to consider if cold-like symptoms are not resolving.

Signs and Symptoms include:

- nasal congestion or runny nose
- scratchy throat
- sneezing
- dry, hacking cough or a repetitive cough
- itchy, red or watery eyes
- headache
- dizziness
- nausea
- difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- wheezing and flare ups of asthma is common

Treatment includes:

- Consult doctor or pediatrician
- Washing hands with soap and water after being outside.
- Rinsing face with cool water
- Wiping off hair with a wet paper towel after being outside
- Drink plenty of water
- Take over the counter allergy medication
 - o There are several to choose from and you need to find the one that works for you
 - It may take several days for the medication start to working

Any medication that needs to be taken at school requires an <u>HCPSS Medication Form</u> to be filled out by the student's doctor/PCP. This includes **ALL** over the counter medications and eye drops.

Students may not stay inside for PE or recess unless the health room has a doctor's note with information about pollen count restrictions and duration of the restriction.

2024-2025 Bus Service Registration

Parents/guardians whose children are eligible for bus transportation are asked to register to receive bus service each year to help the school system plan for student transportation needs. The transportation registration process will run through May 31st. The process will be completed online via HCPSS Connect Synergy. Registration must be done for each eligible student.

To be eligible for bus service, your child's home address must be outside of a school's walk zones. You can verify address eligibility in the HCPSS School Attendance Area Locator. After inputting your address, a window will appear that will indicate either bus or walk for each school level. Please note, the attendance area locator also includes a link for the bus stop locator, which is set for the current school year. Bus stop information for the 2024-2025 school year will be available in August.

You do not need to take any action if:

- Your child is not eligible for bus transportation
- Your child receives transportation as part of their Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan, or
- Your child is a graduating senior

This is a gentle reminder that our school start time is 8:30 a.m. We appreciate your enthusiasm for getting your children to school on time, but please remember that dropping off too early can create safety concerns and supervision challenges as no adults are assigned prior to 8:30 a.m. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring a smooth and safe start to the day for all students.

2024-2025 Kindergarten Registration

Do you have a relative, friend or neighbor that has a child who will be 5 years old by September 1, 2024? Tell them it's time to register for kindergarten!

Kindergarten <u>registration</u> kicked off Monday, March 4. Parents can begin the enrollment process online, after which a member of our front office team will contact you to complete the registration process. Current HCPSS prekindergarten students do not need to be re-registered for kindergarten because they are already enrolled as an HCPSS student. Learning Together Peer (LTP) Program

The Dayton Oaks Elementary Regional Early Childhood Center (RECC) prekindergarten programs are making preparations for classes for the upcoming 2024-2025 school year and are accepting applications for students to participate as peers through the Learning Together Peer (LTP) Program. These classes include children with and without disabilities. The program's focus is helping all children develop communication, literacy, math, problem solving,

motor, and social skills. Parents of children who will be 3 or 4 by September 1st, can pick up an application in the Dayton Oaks Elementary School's front office.

In alignment with *Maryland's Blueprint for the Future*, a limited number of new applications for students turning 4 by September 1 will be available. The Howard County Public School System continues to offer a prekindergarten program for income eligible children who will be four years old by September 1. HCPSS is committed to providing instruction based on the statewide Early Learning Standards which are in alignment with Kindergarten Readiness. The fees listed in the application will be collected monthly regardless of the learning model determined by HCPSS throughout the upcoming school year (virtual, hybrid, in person, or class quarantine). Student Technology Reminder - Personal Devices

Recently, we have noticed an increase in the number of students bringing personal technology devices to school. These include cell phones, Apple watches, Gizmo watches, and other personal devices that include text messaging capabilities. These items have been disruptive to classroom instruction, therefore, we wanted to uplift the HCPSS Policy regarding personal technology devices in elementary schools:

<u>HCPSS Policy 8080</u> - Responsible Use of Technology, Digital Tools, and Social Media states that elementary school students "will keep personal technology devices in backpacks during the school day, unless otherwise authorized by school administrators or instructional staff."

If your child has a personal device, please review this policy with them. As stated in Policy 8080, students who bring these devices to school will be instructed to place them in their backpacks for the duration of the school day. Thank you for your partnership.

HCPSS Emergency Notifications

As we head into winter weather, families are reminded that in emergency situations (including inclement weather), information will be shared with the community only through the HCPSS website, email and text, Twitter and the HCPSS weather hotline. Be sure your Family File is up to date and that you have opted into texts to receive emergency messages.

Volunteer Training Required for Volunteers and Visitors

Anyone volunteering at school in any capacity, including parents joining their children for lunch, are required to complete volunteer training prior to their first visit. Attendance/Reporting Absences

Parents can email <u>DOESabsence@hcpss.org</u> to report a student's absence. Please include your child(ren)'s full name, parent's/guardian's full name and phone number, the date your child(ren) was absent and the reason. Parents may instead choose to send in a paper excuse note to their child's teacher with the same information when the student returns to school.

For families requesting local discretionary absences, please complete a <u>Local Discretionary</u> <u>Absence Request Form</u> and submit it to the front office at least one week in advance.
